Members and Alumni Celebrate Being Mortgage Free

n Friday, October 27, at Prairie Moon Winery, more than 130 Beta Sigs and their significant others gathered to celebrate that Epsilon Chapter is now debt free! Chapter President Caleb Mueller '15 kicked off the evening with a welcome to the group, led us in the traditional dinner song, while Pastor David Beagley, the Chapter's pastoral advisor of 10 years, led us in prayer.

Mark Anderson '93 discussed Epsilon's journey through recent decades and the recommitment of our brotherhood to the three S's of spiritual, scholastic, and social, which is the foundation for today's recruitment and scholastic success and the decision to refinance the mortgage.

MATCHING GIFT CHALLENGE

Capital campaign chairman, Lynn Anderson '66, then spoke about the work done with the campaign and the decision to pursue the purchase of another Chapter House, rather than a remodel of the 223 Lynn Property. Lynn went on to announce that an anonymous donor has pledged to match all donations to our Housing Fund (2702648) and Endowed Scholarship Funds (2701227) at the Iowa State Foundation, dollar for dollar up to the first \$25,000 in calendar year 2017.



IMPROVEMENT PLANS FOR EPSILON CHAPTER

Alumni Board President **Jarod Carl '00** presented the Alumni Board's strategic plan for life after a mortgage. The Chapter House is in critical need of repair, and they intend to use the ISU Foundation Housing Fund money to re-roof the Chapter House and remodel upstairs bathrooms and first floor wood flooring. There is also plans to modernize the study rooms with new carpet and furniture and improve the energy efficiency with new window hardware.

The board would also like to invest in our in-house scholarship program. Their vision is that all cash proceeds from the ISU Foundation Endowed Scholarship Funds will be used for scholarships for our active members each year.

Alumni Scholarship Chairman Kevin Stinn '02 awarded the scholarship committee's selections for two Darryl Jahn scholarships for incoming freshmen, which were awarded to Charles Magee '17 and Cameron Johnson '17 as the in-house winners. Reed Burress '15 was selected to receive the Lynn Anderson Beta Sigma Psi Leadership Scholarship, a \$2,000 scholarship set up by the Andersons to reward Epsilon members who have shown outstanding leadership in the Chapter and on campus.

The group sang "Cross, Heart, and Rose," "Loyal Brothers," and ended the evening with a champagne toast. Congratulations to the members and alumni of Beta Sigma Psi on being mortgage free.
