# Serving the Men of Beta Sigma Psi Barbara Gurganus Shares the Joys of Being Housemother at Epsilon Chapter



ousemother Barbara Gurganus became acquainted with the men of Beta Sigma Psi at ISU years before she served them full time. "A group of young men came to my home in Ames to help me with some yard work," Barb shared. "This showed what kind of character the men of Beta Sig had and I became interested in them as a whole." A few years later, her friend and former housemother, A.J. Walters,

recommended she apply for the open position. Barb has enjoyed being able to support the young men in the house ever since.

Barb spends her days supporting the members living in the house and advising them on where to go to solve an academic or personal problem. "These are young men who have left home for the first time," Barb said, "They come to Iowa State as boys out of high school and leave four years later as men, smarter and able to make decisions for themselves." She enjoys spending time with the members of Epsilon Chapter because their conversations help the young men learn from their own experiences, and Barb gets a taste of current culture.

Every semester is different, as each brings a new group of freshmen to know. Barb also makes an effort to meet the members' parents and assure

# them that their sons are in good hands and in a nurturing environment. She makes a point to teach the men of Epsilon Chapter proper etiquette and proper behavior. Barb sticks by Beta Sigma Psi's three S's: spiritual, scholarship, and social.

As housemother, Barb enjoys spending her time engaging in the history of her own family and makes a point to bring this into the minds of the young men in the house. "Many of the members come from other cities in Iowa, small and large, and sometimes from out of state. I want them to know about Iowa, what it offers to those who live here, and the accomplishments of those who have lived in Iowa in the past," she stated. She recently came across a list of 10 inventors from Iowa whose inventions have changed our lives in the 21st century. These inventors include men like E.F. Lindquist, the creator of the ACT test, and George Gallup, the creator of the wellknown surveying method called the Gallup Poll. "The father of the digital computer, John Vincent Atanasoff, came from right here at Iowa State," Barb said.

Barb is no stranger to the Iowa State campus; her husband was a professor at the university, and Barb remains active in the ISU Women's Club with other faculty wives. ## Richard Osslund— Capacity Building Scholarship

The Ames Alumni Board of Beta Sigma Psi Lutheran Fraternity sponsors the Richard Osslund—Capacity Building Scholarship. The program is designed to build capacity and raise the level of awareness in the importance of thanking clergy and youth ministers who provide leadership and spiritual programming to young people each and every day in Lutheran organizations.

The scholarships are intended to be used by clergy for professional development to advance programming for youth in their respective Lutheran congregation. Funds may be used by individual clergy to attend a conference or seminar for professional development. Youth leadership and programming materials may be purchased with justification of how the materials will be used to enhance the youth programming in the Lutheran congregation.

Scholarships will be awarded in two cycles each year. Applications will be due January 15 and July 15. Scholarship applications will be reviewed by the scholarship review committee, scored, and ranked. The Ames Alumni Board will review and approve recommendations from the selection committee. Richard Osslund—Capacity Building Scholarships will then be awarded.

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship, individuals must work for or be affiliated in a youth leadership capacity with a Lutheran church organization classified as 501(c)(3) tax-exempt under the Internal Revenue Code, must be Iowa based, and cannot be a private foundation under Section 509(a).

The Ames Alumni Board anticipates awarding up to \$3,000 annually in capacity building scholarships. Each scholarship award will be valued up to \$250. First cycle, we will award six \$250 scholarships and, in the second cycle, we will award an additional six \$250 scholarships. Mark your calendar for these key dates.
