

reetings! It's hard to believe that we are already in December! It's been a busy year so far with the completion of house projects, including tuckpointing, the completion of sprinkler renovations, and the dining room project. The men have been heavily involved on campus and are working hard to grow the Beta Sig experience at Iowa State University.

With everything going on, I want to take a moment to reflect on the lives and legacies of two very important men who helped positively shape our Fraternity over the past 25 years.

In August, we unexpectedly lost John "Cookie" Anderson '05. John served as the house cook for 23 years, beginning his Beta Sig experience in the fall of 2000. John was more than just a cook; for nearly a quarter century, he fostered relationships with and mentored 400 Beta Sigs during their undergraduate years. The first question often asked by alumni returning to Ames was, "Where's John?" John was also heavily involved at Memorial Lutheran and on the awards committee for the National Fraternity. As a testament to the man he was, approximately 300 Beta Sigs returned to Ames to pay their respects during his funeral and visitation services. Thank you, John, for all the wonderful memories!

In September, **Chad Winterhof '97** succumbed to a 30-month battle with brain cancer. Chad served as a leader during his undergraduate years from 1996-2000, served the National Fraternity, and helped lead the *Brothers for All Time* capital campaign that led us to where we are today. Chad's motto was "Be Kind and Give Care"—words we can all live by. Chad not only inspired us at the 2022 Homecoming banquet with his words of strength, courage, and encouragement but also through his years

of mentoring and guidance! I, and many more, fondly remember Chad's involvement during our undergraduate years, whether it was a meeting, a side conversation, sharing a joke, or a friendly note. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Chad's family: his wife, Jennifer, and his kids, Brenna and James.

Beta Sigma Psi is a better organization because of John and Chad's guidance, devotion, and love. Their legacies will continue with us. They will be truly missed.

Secondly, we have one major project still in the works. In early spring, the stairs to the deck were condemned by the city due to age. The dad of a current member has graciously donated time and effort to help assess and design a new set of stairs for the deck. At this time, the Foundation will cover half the cost, with roughly \$19,000 remaining in needed cash. EPSILON CHAPTER'S INVOLVEMENT ACROSS CAMPUS AND THE COMMUNITY

Chapter! We have 46 men on the roster this fall and welcomed new house chef Dawn Rettalick. Dawn has done a great job, and it has been a blessing to have her.

Over the past year, the Chapter has seen great success and recognition at ISU for its academic achievement. Beta Sigma Psi ranked third among fraternities with a 3.31 GPA in the spring and third overall last fall with a 3.34 GPA (2022). This fall, our goal is to have the number one GPA on campus. We have remained in the top five fraternities each semester and are very proud of the consistency we have displayed when it comes to academics.

On the philanthropic side, we hosted our Sunset Cookout in the spring, benefiting The Puppy Jake Foundation, and raised more than \$1,400. We hosted our Beta Sig Brunch this fall and raised more than \$2,100 for Habitat for Humanity. Epsilon Chapter also supports Habitat by volunteering at the Ames Re-Store biweekly.

Spiritually, the Chapter is heavily involved with Memorial Lutheran Church. Members frequently attend, read, usher, play handbells, and more during the service. Also, the church hosts Friday International Student Hospitality Dinners with the Beta Sigs preparing, serving, and cleaning after the meals.

Socially, the men recently finished competing in Homecoming with Alpha Omicron Pi and Kappa Sigma. We competed in Greek Week with Alpha Delta Pi and Alpha Sigma Phi this past spring and took home third place overall! We also competed in lots of intramurals, multiple brotherhood events throughout the semester, and socials with other fraternities and sororities.

The future looks bright here at Epsilon Chapter. We are excited about our achievements and look forward to seeing Beta Sig continue to grow. At MEF, we took home three awards: the Welge Award (best recruitment program), Founders Cup (best new member education program), and the Jorns Award (community service and philanthropy).
